It is Easter and I am a day late but I know that the submission will not be dealt with until Tuesday at the earliest so I am submitting this comment.

The Marinus Link project is another example of this Government's bubble thinking. All the money the Government gives to support industries such as Forestry and Coastal Salmon Farming is a debt to us.

The Stadium bubble idea will bankrupt the state as well, so where is the money going to come from for a Marinus Link?

The government thinks we the people will pay for it but we will not be able to.

We are already struggling to pay for basic accomodation and food.

With this development electricity prices for Tasmanians will continue to rise as our power gets exported to the mainland!

There is no benefit to Tasmania for this development.

There is no reason for anyone on the mainland to need our power (as they are building renewable systems at a rapid rate) so the only plan is to buy power from the mainland and bring it via the link to Tasmania and then store it in hydro dams, so we can sell it back cross Bass Strait at peak times.

Where is the business plan that proves any return to Tasmania and how the people of Tasmania will be compensated for the increase in prices and the destruction of farms and forest land in the construction of the infrastructure planned to litter the countryside?

The people of Tasmania, particularly in the NW (who will be directly negatively impacted), do not want Marinus Link to go ahead as I do not in the interests of the people.
