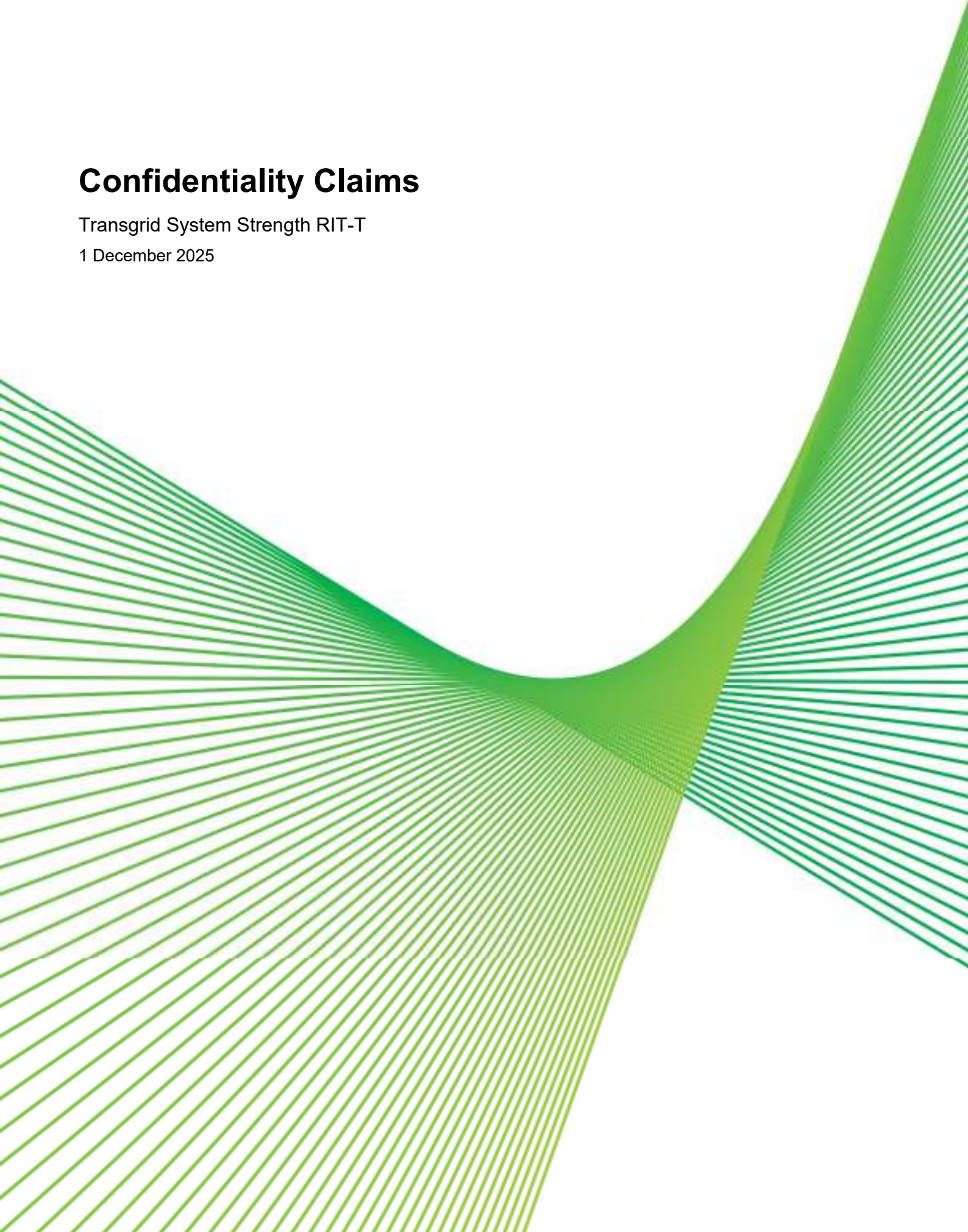

Confidentiality Claims

This document sets out Transgrid's confidentiality claims for its Information Request response for the dispute filed by the Centre for Independent Studies upon Transgrid's RIT-T for maintaining system strength in NSW, in accordance with Australian Energy Regulator's Confidentiality Guideline 2017.

The public version of the document has redactions on 22% of the pages of the document covering 3.5% of the text. Each redaction is classed in one of the following categories based on the AER's confidentiality guidelines:

- Information affecting the security of the network
- Market sensitive cost inputs
- Market intelligence
- Strategic information
- Personal information
