

Whom it may concern

I am located in the Adelaide Plains/Light section of the corridor.

Regarding the public consultation it is basically non-existent. I have seen posts on ElectraNets website about pop up information sessions ElectraNet has held and myself and no one I know in Gawler River, Lewiston and Penfield Gardens has ever heard of this. Not only that the few who have heard of it like myself have very vague information.

It was brought to my attention very recently from a neighbour who received a letter. I myself have received no such letter nor have the rest of my neighbours. After contacting ElectraNet it was suggested but not guaranteed that anyone who has not received a letter is likely not to be effected.

After further correspondence that I instigated ElectraNet has been made clear that no such assumptions have been made, and that anyone in the marked zone whether they received a letter or not is at potential risk.

After several correspondence with multiple ElectraNet staff members, we still don't know:

Where the line is going (most important detail of all)?

What kinds of compensation would be applied?

It's not public consultation if majority of people don't know about it and the few that do, don't know the most basic details of the project.

How can you have any serious kind of public consultation when no one knows the most crucial information of all.

The general narrative in my correspondence has been "don't worry too much." But how are we to know if that's genuine? Or B, we are told not to worry, so we don't and just ignore it, there will be minimal backlash, meanwhile the consultation period ends etc, etc.

It is mentioned on their website that the greater Adelaide area has had the most positive feedback. No one there knows about it?
