Dawson Valley Pipeline – proposed access arrangement

On 5 February 2007, Anglo Coal (Dawson) Limited, Anglo Coal (Dawson Management) Pty Ltd and Mitsui Moura Investment Pty Ltd lodged, for approval by the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC) under the provisions of the *National Third Party Access Code for Natural Gas Pipeline Systems*, a proposed access arrangement covering the Dawson Valley Pipeline.

The proposed access arrangement describes the terms and conditions under which the service providers will offer third party access to the Dawson Valley Pipeline.

The Australian Energy Regulator (AER) is assisting the ACCC in the assessment of this proposed access arrangement. The proposed access arrangement and supporting documentation are available from the AER website¹ at http://www.aer.gov.au/content/index.phtml/itemId/708620/fromItemId/703754
