
Dear Clare,

New South Wales 2023-24 forecast reliability gap is no longer forecast to occur

The 2020 Electricity Statement of Opportunities (ESOO) identified a forecast reliability gap in 2023-24 in New South Wales. In November 2020, in accordance with section 14I(4)(b) of the National Electricity Law (NEL) and clause 4A.C.2 of the National Electricity Rules (NER), AEMO made a request that the Australian Energy Regulator (AER) consider making a T-3 reliability instrument for this forecast reliability gap. Subsequently, the AER made a T-3 reliability instrument for the forecast reliability gap in December 2020.

AEMO hereby notifies the AER under clause 4A.C.5 of the NER that the forecast reliability gap referred to in AEMO's November 2020 request is no longer forecast to occur.
