1.1.1 Background

The Australian Energy Regulator (AER) facilitated a second teleconference on 10 July 2012 to discuss the revised queuing requirements for the Roma to Brisbane Pipeline Gas Transmission System (RBP). 1.1.3 Topics discussed during the teleconference

Existing capacity

- Circumstances in which users would lose the deposit
- Good faith negotiations
- The period of time allowed for users to pay any deposit

- Timing issue—when an offer of capacity is made for capacity which will not be available for several years. Difficulties genuine users face in making decisions, plus a non-refundable deposit now being required.
- Option—requiring different deposits depending on when the capacity offered to a user will be available.

Developable capacity

- Establishing an order of priority, but negotiating in any order as long as users of a higher priority are not disadvantaged—what does “not disadvantaged” cover?
