## Re: SA Power Networks Electricity Distribution Price Review for 2020/21 - 2024/25: Public Lighting

The City of Port Lincoln welcomes the opportunity to make a submission in relation to the SA Power Networks (SAPN) Electricity Distribution Price Review 2020/21-2024/25 for public lighting. Council would like to acknowledge the important role the Australian Energy Regulator (AER) plays in providing a fair and transparent process for pricing determinations around public lighting.

Council is located more than 600 kilometres from Adelaide on the southern tip of Eyre Peninsula and has a population of just over 14,000 residents. The city is home to approximately 2,000 street lights and we have been actively involved in representing regional areas on street lighting issues.

Since late 2018, representatives from The City of Port Lincoln have been participating in a Public Lighting Working Group (Working Group), formed to facilitate a practical and representative interface between SAPN and South Australian public lighting customers, including councils and the SA Government's Department of Planning Transport and Infrastructure (DPTI). It was established as a representative body for negotiating issues under the current regulatory framework and facilitating the practical transition to the new regulatory framework commencing in July 2020.

The Working Group is coordinated and chaired by the Local Government Association of South Australia (LGA), and is comprised of representatives of the City of Charles Sturt, City of Holdfast Bay, City of Mitcham, Mount Barker District Council, City of Mount Gambier, City of Norwood Payneham and St Peters, City of Onkaparinga, City of Port Lincoln, City of Prospect and City of West Torrens.

The introduction of the Working Group has resulted in a marked improvement in the relationship and level of communication between SAPN and the local government sector. The information provided through the Working Group has enabled councils to have a broader understanding of public lighting services and the ability to provide input into future processes.


